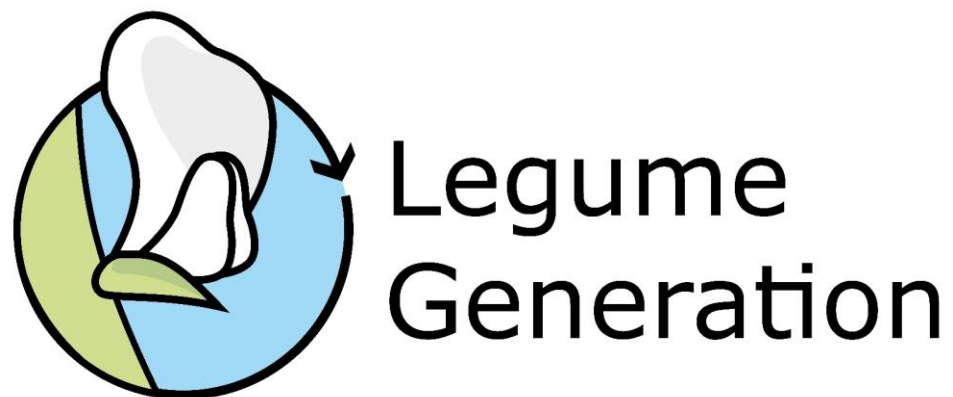

The goal of the project is to support the sustainable development of European farming and food systems by increasing the competitiveness of European-grown legume crops.

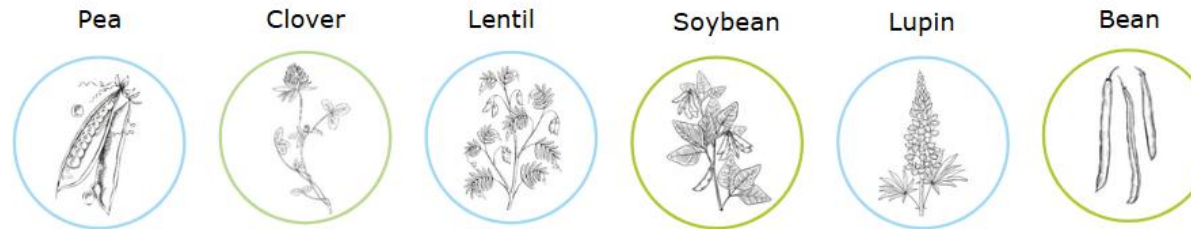


The performance of legume crops compared with other cropping options must be raised by a combination of increased yield and increased crop value.

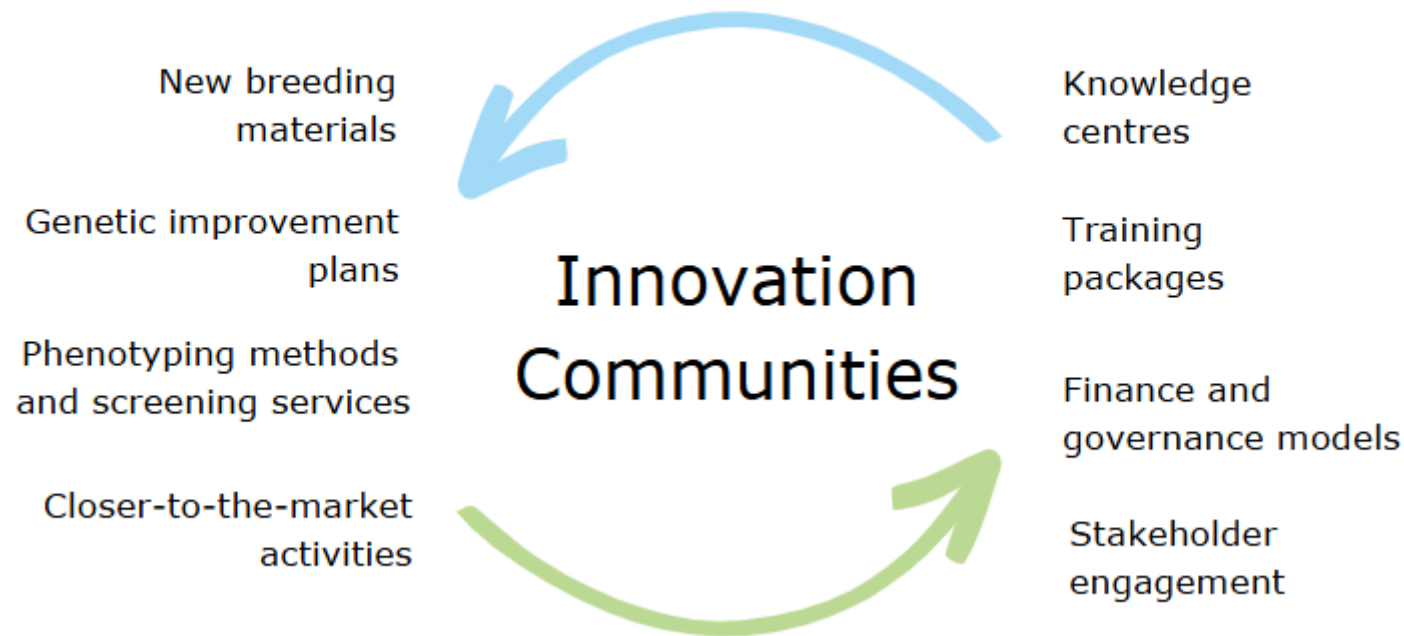
